### 1.2 Snooker - Handicap Doubles Championships

(April - May: Nominations March 2017)
$>$ This tournament is the best of three frames straight knockout with best of 5 frames final.
$>$ Total prize money of $\$ 100$ per tournament
$>$ Winner $\$ 50$, Runner up $\$ 30$, Losing semi finalists $\$ 10$

### 2.1 Snooker - A, B and C Grade Scratch Championships

(June - August: nominations May 2017)
$>$ A Grade is a best of five frames straight knockout with best of 7 frames final.
$>B$ Grade is a best of three frames straight knockout with best of 5 frames final.
$>C$ grade is a best of three frames straight knockout for all matches.
$>C$ Grade players may also play in A and B Grade
>B grade players may also play in A Grade
> Total prize money of $\$ 100$ per tournament
> Winner $\$ 50$, Runner up $\$ 30$, Losing semi finalists $\$ 10$

### 2.2 Billiards - Scratch Championship

(June - August: nominations May 2017)
> This tournament is the first to 300 with the final first to 500.
$>$ Depending on number of entries, a round robin phase may be played before knockout finals
$>$ Total prize money of $\$ 100$ per tournament

### 3.2 Billiards - Handicap Championship

(September - November: Nominations August 2017)
